

REGULAR MEETING

March 12, 2009

Supervisor Gozelski called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM.

Village of Castile Mayor Kendrick “Scott” Fischer explained to the Board the invoice which had been sent to the Town for the installation of the sewer at the Town Hall and Highway Garage. Originally the Village was told they could be paid for with grant funds, but as the sewer project was done, they dealt with 3 governors and 7 administrators. They are now being told no government municipal buildings can receive grant funds. Marty Mucher, Executive Director of Wyoming County Community Action, Inc. whose office handled the grants, reiterated that grant funds could not be used for any “not for profits” as originally thought. Of the approximately 400 households in the Village, 170 -180 were able to use the grant funds.

Eric Perry addressed the Board regarding Wyoming County Partners for Prevention (P4P). He discussed problem gambling. The lottery began with a drawing once a month and now is every four minutes (Quick Draw). 5% of education’s money comes from the lottery.

Motion was made by Coun. Klein, seconded by Coun. Little, resolved that the minutes of December 30th year-end meeting, January 10th special meeting-Town audit, January 15th organizational meeting, and February 12th regular meeting be approved as submitted.

Motion was made by Coun. Klein, seconded by Coun. Little, resolved to introduce the proposed Local Law 1 – 2009 amending Local Law #2 – 1993, Land Use Law of the Town of Castile, and provides for notification of public hearings. Said law, after laying on the table for seven days, will be brought on for a hearing on April 8, 2009 at 7:00 PM and a notice of the hearing will be published in the Perry Herald.

Supervisor Gozelski advised the Board that the Town of Castile again has the privilege of selecting a young person to receive a free campership to 4 – H Camp Wyomoco. He is seeking suggested names.

The stimulus package, if Federally approved for Wyoming County, will be used on Bixby Road in Arcade (1.4 miles at a cost of \$3/4 million) and Broughton Road in Gainesville (2.5 miles/\$1.4 million).

Coun. Little reported that the Castile Historical Society met on March 5th. Linda Faryna, a volunteer who has transcribed a series of Civil War letters, read them to the Society revealing a glimpse of a local soldier's life during the war.

PWMS Kibler gave his report. The rate of flow is up due to recent rain and snow melt.

Hwy Supt Foley gave his report. Rolling over the cemetery maintenance contract was discussed; is it possible to add a \$500 fuel increase. He was instructed to check with the Town Attorney.

Foley has obtained three truck quotes (chassis only): Western Star \$116,647; Volvo \$123,339; Mack \$117,139.

The Clerk reported that she had received 21 applications for the advertised position of Deputy Town Clerk. Less than 10% of Town taxes remain outstanding. The fire contract has been received from the Village of Perry but includes new stipulations to consider.

Rich Eliaz addressed the Board regarding the need for Local Law 1 – 2009. He also stated there are no laws on the books to deal with town houses. He asked if the Board wants the Planning Board to ask other Planning Boards what they are doing with town houses, and look into state regulations. There are no county regulations. He also discussed "keyholing" (ex. Dock that extends in front of neighbor's property).

The next GLOW hazardous waste collection day will be May 9th at Rock Glen.
