The Water/Sewer Report was reviewed. Darryl Nourse reported that one pump has been rebuilt.

D. Nourse presented his Highway Report. He stated that the Town of Perry and Town of

Castile were the only ones in the County that stayed at full staff during this part of the pandemic.

Sup Klein stated that the Town of Castile owns a paver with the Towns of Perry and Warsaw and that Darryl has found a newer paver that with the trade would cost \$350,000. He stated that he had received paperwork from the bank for a BAN but then received word that the Town of Warsaw is not interested in being part of the new paver.

D. Nourse stated that to rent a paver for 1 day is \$6800 and that we could rent the paver, which would include manpower, to other municipalities. He stated that the Villages of Castile and Perry would be able to use it at no cost as they are part of the Towns that will be purchasing it. He also stated that he would like to find another municipality that would like to share this expense. He stated that through shared services that the County may be able to purchase a trailer for the paver to be hauled in exchange for their use of the paver.

Coun Vitagliano stated that if other municipalities were to rent it that we need to make sure that a good rental agreement is drawn up.

Coun Barber asked if anyone has heard anything about CHIPS money.

Sup Klein stated that nobody has heard anything at the county level but there is concern of a possible cutback because of what is going on.

Coun Vitagliano questioned if the Town of Perry has already approved the purchase of the paver.

D. Nourse stated that they have.

Coun Hurst asked where the paver would be stored.

D. Nourse stated that it will be stored at the Town of Perry just like the other one has been.

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The Assessor's Report was reviewed.

The Town received a letter from ZEO Jenna Marley regarding upcoming public hearings for ZBA and Planning Boards. She stated that she has reached out to Atty Kelly on 2 occasions but has not heard back.

Sup Klein stated at the County level they are doing their meetings through Zoom. As long as it is advertised with the address that the public can connect to then it is fine.

Sup Klein stated that we could also do meetings with social distancing (6 feet apart) at the Government Center and if the meeting room is too small we can open the petition.

A motion was made by Coun Hurst, seconded by Coun Barber in favor of holding public hearings for the Zoning Department in the Government Center using social distancing was approved.

Sup Klein stated that several letters were received from committees that receive donations from the Town to show how the donations are being used.

Sup Klein stated that he received a message from DiPietro's office asking if there was anything that he could do for the Town because of the pandemic. He stated that items such as loss of funding our things that could impact our infrastructure to be given extra thought and asked the Board to think of items that could affect us.

Sup Klein stated that he received a message from Susan Beeker with a complaint that when our Highway Department was working on the Perry Road she noticed that social distancing was not being used and that no masks were being worn.

Sup Klein stated that as long as they are 6 feet apart that masks need not to be worn.

D. Reed, Village Trustee, was present to discuss the need for a policy for COVID-19 for the building. He stated that since we are all in the building together that it makes sense for us to have 1 policy. He stated that he received guidelines from OSHA such as using one door in, one door out, name and contact person of each person that comes into the building, only 1 person allowed at a time and by appointment only, etc.

Coun Vitagliano asked if there were any templates.

Sup Klein will contact DiPietro's office and the County to see if any templates are available.

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Sup Klein stated that he would like to commend the Highway Department, Sewer Department and Clerk for everything they have done, they have gone above and beyond and stayed our course during the pandemic. He stated that we are here to do what the public needs, which we have done, and we are still in good shape financially. He stated that he is very proud of the people in this Town and the employees here and appreciates them very much and would lead this Town anytime.

Coun Barber asked if we can get flags for the cemetery and Government Center.

D. Nourse stated that he usually gets them from Agway but has 3 at the shop.

Coun Barber also asked if the building in the cemetery is getting fixed.

D. Nourse stated that it is on his list for this year.

Coun Barber asked if the fences around the trees that were planted last year could be removed.

D. Nourse stated that he will take them down.
