At 7:15 pm a Public Hearing was opened to consider Local Law #2-2014 authorizing a property tax levy in excess of the limit established in General Municipal Law 3-c.

The law was discussed and no one appeared for or against it.

At 7:20 pm the Public Hearing was closed.

A <u>motion</u> was made by Mayor Granger, seconded by Tr Reed, that the following Local Law be adopted: #2-14 Authorizing a property tax levy in excess of the limit established in General Municipal Law 3-c.

## Section 1: Legislative Intent

It is the intent of this local law to allow the Village of Castile to adopt a budget for the fiscal year commencing June 1, 2014 that requires a real property tax levy in excess of the "tax levy limit" as defined by General Municipal Law §3-c.

# Section 2: Authority

This local law is adopted pursuant to subdivision 5 of the General Municipal Law §3-c, which expressly authorized a local government's governing body to override the property tax cap for the coming fiscal year by the adoption of a local law approved by a vote of sixty percent (60%) of said governing body.

## Section 3: Tax Levy Limit Override

The Board of Trustees of the Village of Castile is hereby authorized to adopt a budget for the fiscal year commencing June 1, 2014 that requires a real property tax levy in excess of the amount otherwise prescribed in General Municipal Law §3-c.

## Section 4: Severability

If a Court determines that any clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, or part of this local law or application thereof to any person, firm or corporation, or circumstances is invalid or unconstitutional, the Court's order of judgment shall not affect, impair, or invalidate the remainder of this local law or in its application to the person, individual, firm or corporation or circumstance, directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment or order shall be rendered.

### Section 5: Effective Date

This local law shall take effect February 18, 2014 and upon filing with the Office of the Secretary of State.

Bills as listed on Abstract #18 in the amounts of \$3,971.57 for General Funds, \$86,245.45 for Electric Funds, \$806.84 for Water Funds and \$464.17 for Sewer Funds were audited.

A motion was made by Tr Washburn, seconded by Tr Reed, that the bills be approved and paid.

There are frozen water lines at 6 and 32 South Main Street and at the Trailer Park at Hurd Street.
